The following reports the results of every Special and General Court-Martial tried within the United States Navy in June 2023. The cases are separated by the Navy Region in which they were tried. On 21 June 2023, consistent with the plea agreement, the military judge sentenced him to two-thirds forfeitures of pay for 12 months, 12 months confinement, a reduction in paygrade to E-1, and a Bad Conduct Discharge.
